

Prints of Maekawa Senpan —

September 10 - October 20, 2019

A print maker and cartoonist MAEKAWA Senpan was born in Kyoto City in 1888. In 1907, he entered the Kansai Bijutsuin (Fine Arts Academy in Kansai) and learned Western style painting under ASAI Chu and KANOKOGI Takeshiro. He moved to Tokyo in 1911, and the following year, he began working at the cartoon magazine publisher Tokyo Puck and Yomiuri Shimbun News Paper. Having the work field at journalism, his serial comic strip on Yomiuri Sunday Cartoon of Yomiuri News Paper Hasty Kuma-san achieved popularity, and his name was widely known.

On the other hand, influenced by MINAMI Kunzo's print works, Senpan began working on woodcuts. In 1919, he joined in the first exhibition of the Nihon Sosaku-hanga Kyokai (Association of the Japanese Creative Prints), and his career as a print artist started up. After that, exhibiting his works at the Nihon Hanga Kyokai (Association of Japanese Prints, the following group the Nihon Sosaku-hanga Kyokai), exhibitions by government like Teiten (the exhibition of the Imperial Art Academy), and Shunyokai exhibitions, he contributed to the development of the Japanese modern prints as one of the important print artists.

Even though he modestly regarded his position too high for his ability, his simple style same as his personality and his works depicting the general populace with a loving look were widely welcomed. Even in wartime, his easy-going mind was still alive, and talked at the exhibition speech as follows: I am happy if you could find a slight calmness here at this unusual situation and in your uneasy feeling.

This exhibition is the first solo show of the artist after the one at the Riccar Museum in 1977. With about 70 works and related materials, we want you to enjoy Senpan's personally and artistically calm magnetism.
